Since it was so simple, it allowed the emphasis to be on the looks even if they were as simple as a black single breasted suit. 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Giorgio Armani is back strong after a long break because of the global pandemic where he had canceled his shows since 2020. Armani was the first brand to actually **cancel their show entirely** but it was crucial as “As Giorgio Armani has expressed on many occasions, the shows are crucial and irreplaceable occasions but the health and safety of both employees and the public must once again take priority,” said the Milan-based fashion house earlier this year to Vogue. He allowed only 80 people to this show as the **Via Borgonuovo offers 800 seats**. Armani put great effort into this collection as it was his “big comeback.” Armani links this new concept of comfort and lightweight suits with the pandemic as he thinks things should be more casual in the times we are in right now. That was his goal in these suits in this show- **casual**, sexy and put together.
